#### 12.2 Honorary Fellows of CON

Honorary Fellowship shall be conferred on non-members of the Organization where in the opinion of the Organization, such persons have made significant contributions to education in Nigeria. Not more than two such awards shall be made at one and the same conference. It shall be a good opportunity for the local organizing committee (LOC) of a conference to nominate two names for the consideration and approval of the National Executive Committee at its meeting in March or thereabout.

So far, no persons have been nominated for the award of honorary fellow of CON.

#### 13. Membership of CON

Membership of CON is open to all persons interested in curriculum development, research and evaluation. There are six (6) categories of membership: Student, Associate, Full, Institutional, Fellow, and Honorary Fellow.

#### 13.1 New Members (on yearly basis)

Membership is effected upon the completion of a prescribed registration form, and the payment of a registration fee, which, like other dues and levies, is determined by the National Executive Committee from time to time and approved by the Annual General Meeting.

#### 13.2 Organs of CON

CON has the following organs:

- 1. Annual General Meeting (AGM);
- 2. National Executive Committee;
- 3. Chapters;
- 4. Board of Fellows; and
- 5. Board of Trustees.

Their roles and responsibilities are spelt out in the organization's Constitution.

I feel that it may take time to locate it and therefore not able to meet our publication schedule should we insist on getting it and using its content. However, we can make an update in the future when we have a revised edition of the brochure. Then, members with information to bridge the gaps in the brochure would have supplied them.

This notwithstanding, I am very pleased at the product before us; and I am confident that many members of CON will be satisfied with what we have produced. I sincerely thank the Chairman and members of the committee that worked on this brochure; and in particular appreciate the untiring support of Prof. U M O Ivowi, our Grand Patron, in initiating this project and seeing it through to a successful end.

#### 1. A Brief History of CON

CON was conceptualized by the staff of the Department of Curriculum Studies, University of Jos, Jos in 1982. Prominent amongst the staff were Profs. P N Lassa, Etim and Sali Bao. The proposal for the formation of the body was drafted and circulated to universities faculties of education and institutes of education, and other educational institutions like Comparative Education Study and Adaptation Centre (CESAC) and Nigerian Educational Research Council (NERC).

Individuals were requested to register for membership, either as ordinary members or as fellow and life members with the fee of life members being about ten times that of ordinary members. Based on the encouraging response to this proposal, an International Curriculum Conference was hosted by the Department of Curriculum Studies of the Faculty of Education, University of Jos, Jos in September 1982. At the conference, CON was formally established and launched on 24 September 1982 with its headquarters at the Faculty of Education, University of Jos, Jos. A draft constitution was also accepted for use in which it was decided that fellowship and life membership should not be conferred on any member until after ten years of active membership. All those who had paid for fellowship and life membership were advised to convert the money to appropriate number of annual dues and payment for some documents of CON. At the end of the conference, the foundation Executive Committee (EXCO) was elected. They piloted the affairs of CON until 1986. However, following the relocation of Prof. Bao to United States of America (USA), Dr. Noel Ihebuzor was elected Secretary General at the Annual General Meeting in Jos in 1983.

#### 4. **Foundation Fellows of CON**

The first biennial seminar and fellowship award was slated for 4 March 1999 at the University of Jos, Jos. The recipients were Profs. PAI Obanya, PN Lassa, UM O Ivowi, and S O Ayodele who respectively were the foundation President and Vice President, second President and Editor-in-Chief. After a seminar paper on ------ by Prof. P A I Obanya, with adequate support by UNESCO, Paris, the President, Prof. U M O Ivowi, conferred the fellowship on him and Prof. P N Lassa. In turn, Prof. Obanya, the foundation President of CON, conferred the fellowship award on Prof. U M O Ivowi; after which the incumbent President, Prof. U M O Ivowi, then conferred the fellowship award on Prof. S O Ayodele. Thus the four foundation fellows of CON had their fellowship award on 4 March 1999.

The next Seminar and Fellowship Award was held as planned at Jos on 14 March 2001 but that of 12 March 2003 with the theme: Nigerian Primary Education System in the 21st Century could not be followed through because of the protracted Academic Staff Union of Universities (ASUU) strike. Instead, the award was made on 26 November 2003 during the Annual Conference at University of Port Harcourt, P H. Six and two members were conferred with the fellowship award in 2001 and 2003 respectively. That of 6 April 2005 was held as planned with Prof. P A O Okebukola as the guest speaker on the seminar theme: Quality Assurance in Nigerian Education; and three members were conferred with the Fellowship Award on 6 April 2005 at Jos. Since then, the fellowship awards have taken place during the Annual Conferences of 2007, 2009, 2011, 2014, 2016 and 2018. Now that our secretariat has taken shape properly at the Faculty of Education, University of Jos, Jos, March Seminar and Fellowship Award may resume in 2020.

#### 5. The National Secretariat of CON

Following the inauguration of the Curriculum Organization of Nigeria (CON) in 1982 at the Faculty of Education, University of Jos, Jos and the pioneering role of the faculty staff in its growth and development over the years, the Annual General Meeting of CON in 1989 at Usman Danfodiyo University, Sokoto decided to make the Faculty of Education, University of Jos, the base for CON National Secretariat. This decision was not concretised until 1997 when CON was reactivated. Dr. G.O. Taylor was the director, CDC of NERDC that organized the conference at which CON was reactivated in 1997. In that year it was agreed that all those members who wanted to continue their membership with CON should pay their dues retrospectively and Dr. Taylor was among those who paid up immediately. The now President of CON, Prof. U M O Ivowi, after its resuscitation wrote to the Dean Faculty of Education on 23 July 1997 about the 1989 decision of CON to make Faculty of Education Unijos its base and the Dean, Prof. S U Udoh, gave approval via his letter of 22 September 1997. By this approval, the Faculty officer became the

Administrative Secretary of CON. In order words, the duties of the Administrative Secretary of CON became part of the schedule of the Faculty Officer. In order for the Administrative Secretary to be familiar with the workings of CON, he/she was to be invited to EXCO Meetings of CON at cost to CON. With the appointment of the Faculty Officer, Mrs. E O Ibu, as the first Administrative Secretary of CON, she attended the EXCO Meeting of 30th November 1998 at the University of Lagos; and we enjoyed a good and cordial working relationship with her until she was transferred from the Dean's Office in 2002.

Efforts made to utilize the services of the new Faculty Officer as our Administrative Secretary did not materialize. Over the years, attendance at CON activities by staff of the University of Jos had been extremely poor despite the existence of former strong and active members of CON at the University. Our biennial seminars normally hosted by the University stopped as the 2003 edition was postponed indefinitely because of ASUU strike. The last recorded attendance at CON Annual Conference of members from the University of Jos was at the 13th Annual Conference at Nsukka in 2000.

At a meeting of the Board of Fellows in Port Harcourt on 19 September 2003, the issue of relocating our National Secretariat because of the difficulty in maintaining it and the absence of members of the Faculty at CON conferences was again discussed from the President's brief to the meeting. It was decided that the Grand Patron should write formally to the Faculty of Education at University of Jos about our concern in the continued designation of the Faculty as our National Secretariat since Mrs. Ibu left in 2002. This was to put the Faculty on notice of our intention to relocate the secretariat unless the Faculty took steps to resuscitate its function as earlier approved.

It must be noted that all along when the national secretariat at Jos did not function, the Secretary General used his office as the secretariat of the organization. That is why the functioning secretariat moved to the Faculty of Education, University of Ilorin, Ilorin from 1983 - 1986; to the Faculty of Education, University of Nigeria, Nsukka from 1986 – 1990; NERDC, Sheda, Abuja from 2002 – 2005; Federal College of Education, Eha-Amufu from 2005 – 2010; Faculty of Education, University of Uyo, Uyo from 2010 – 2014; and Faculty of Education, Imo State University, Owerri from 2014 to date

Once the National Secretariat was resuscitated at Jos, and in order to ensure continuity, it was decided to appoint a member of CON based at the Faculty of Education as the Administrative Secretary. Consequently, Dr. Shuaibu Saidu was appointed the Administrative Secretary of CON. Through the support of one of our foundation members, Prof. Mary L Ango, FCON, the Dean of Education, Prof. Mary P Haggai, a big



room with furniture and functioning air conditioner was allocated to CON as its National Secretariat. The Office was formally handed over to CON at a commissioning ceremony on Wednesday, 18 April 2018. The President of CON, Prof. Mrs. T N Kanno, FCON and the Grand Patron, Prof. U M O Ivowi, FCON were among distinguished members of CON present.

7. CON Constitution

Following the formal launching of the Curriculum Organization of Nigeria (CON) on the 24th of September 1982 during an International Curriculum Conference hosted by the Curriculum Studies Department of the University of Jos, Jos, the Organization operated on a draft constitution that was being modified from time to time. At the Annual General Meeting held in Usman Dan Fodiyo University, Sokoto on September 1989, members assembled resolved to give to themselves a formal Constitution in furtherance of the Organization's determination to share knowledge, participate in curriculum development, and undertake research in curriculum studies with the aim of encouraging relevant educational development in Nigeria.

The Organization, which is an association of curriculum experts, teachers, administrators, agencies, and those interested in curriculum research and development in Nigeria, shall continue to make impacts through conferences, seminars, workshops, publications, and other valuable activities.

After its 9th annual conference at the Imo State University, Okigwe now Abia State University, Uturu in 1990, the Organization became moribund from 1991 until 1997 when it was resuscitated and became active once more. Given its consolidation, a second edition of the constitution became necessary for its continued progression in the midst of new thinking and disposition. A draft was considered and approved by the Annual General Meeting held in Port Harcourt on Thursday, 27 November 2003.

The Organization has four objectives as follows:

- 1. To bring together all persons interested in curriculum development for sharing knowledge in the problems and practice of curriculum.
- 2. To promote and strengthen curriculum development, research, and evaluation in Nigeria
- 3. To promote training in curriculum research, development, and evaluation.
- 4. To encourage publication and dissemination of appropriate types in curriculum development, research, and evaluation for all levels of education.


#### 8. Publications of CON

CON intend to achieve its objectives by establishing a communication forum through bulletins, newsletters, a journal which shall be called the Nigerian Journal of Curriculum Studies, and monographs.

#### 8.1 Journals

So far our journal publication has taken the centre stage with its regularity and accommodation of more articles. Currently each issue has four numbers sometimes accompanied by special edition. The colour of the journal is green. The last issue is

Volume 24, Numbers 1–4, published in 2017.

In addition to the journal, monograph in the form of Books of Reading were prodiced as Special Numbers of the journal. Special No. 1 was published by Lagos Chapter in July 1986 from its symposium on Problems and Prospects of the Implementation of the National Policy on Education held from17 -19 June 1986; Special No 2 was that of Jo's Chapter based on its 1986 workshop on Effective Teaching and Learning punished in April 1987; Special No. 3 was based on second Lagos Chapter Symposium on Teacher Education in the Implementation of the 6-3-3-4 System of Education held in June 1985 and published in January 1988; while the Jos Chapter also released Special No. 4. Monographs Nos. 5, 6 and 7 were published as outcomes of the conferences of 1987, 1988 and 1989 in Zaria, Calabar and Sokoto respectively.

#### 8.2 Book Development Effort

In 2009, CON engaged in book project. It produced two standard textbooks on curriculum studies for tertiary institutions. They are;

- 1. Curriculum Theory and Practice
- 2. Curriculum Diversification in Nigeria

#### 8.3 Book in Honour

In 2014 CON engaged in another book project. This time, it produced a book of reading in curriculum studies in honour of the then president of CON, Prof. (Mrs.) A E O Esu. The title of the book is Curriculum and Teaching in Nigeria, edited by Prof. U M O Ivowi. This book is for use in tertiary institutions.

Currently, CON has developed a template for another book of reading in honour of her Grand Patron, Prof. U.M.O Ivowi. The title of the book is Issues in Nigerian Curriculum Development and Implementation, edited by Profs. Uche M Nzewi and T N Kanno This promises to be unique going by the content coverage and the national spread of the contributors to the book of readings. The death of Prof. Kate Nwufo, the initiator of the project, had a temporary setback, which the remaining editors, Profs. Uche Nzewi and T N Kanno had since overcome and have confirmed to deliver as scheduled.

#### 9. Seminars and Fellowship Awards

At the Annual General Meeting held on --- December 1998 at the University of Lagos, Akoka, Lagos, EXCO recommendation that fellowship be awarded to deserving members of CON at a Biennial Seminar to be hosted at its headquarters in Jos on 4 March 1999 was approved. accepted. It was agreed that the biennial seminar must be held in Jos during which occasion fellowship of the organization would be awarded to deserving members. The first seminar was scheduled for 1999 during which four distinguished members were conferred fellows of CON.

At the Annual General Meeting held in University of Nigeria Nsukka on Thursday 21st September 2000, EXCO recommendation for March 2001 seminar was approved. The date was 14th March and seminar topic was "Challenge of Secondary Education in Nigeria in the 21st Century" to be delivered by Prof. S O Ayodele, the Director of Institute of Education, University of Ibadan, Ibadan. Following the report that the first seminar was held at a loss due mainly to poor attendance attributed to the fact that papers were not presented at the seminar, it was agreed that paper presentation should start at the forth-coming seminar. The papers found publishable should be published in the journal of CON. This meant that there would be two journal publications in the seminar year from then on.
